

## **POOL PARTY GUIDELINES – January 2015**

**If a homeowner chooses to have a pool party, exclusive use of the pool is not possible. The pool cannot be reserved for private parties.**

The Board allows pool parties with the understanding that the parents are responsible for their child's safety and behavior. The Pool Company and HOA require for parties over 25 people (parents and children – swimmers and non-swimmers) that the homeowner pays to have another life guard on duty for the duration of the party.

Let me know the anticipated number of people in the party.

The date and time of the pool party needs to be approved by the Board.

**IMPORTANT:** Homeowners will need to submit to the management company the number of people (# of adults and children) and the hours they would be using the pool. The maximum number of guests that a resident may have for a pool party is 60 people with a maximum of 40 swimmers. This includes parents, children, chaperones, babysitters, etc.

After the party request has been approved, the homeowner will need to contact the pool company to arrange for the hiring of a lifeguard for the duration of the party. The homeowner is responsible for the behavior of the guests as well as for cleaning up all areas used by guests.
